



ordost recently introduced its own line of power line connecting cables, which were much awaited by the cognoscenti, in hushed expectation. There are three models, the Shiva and the Vishnu and the all-out statement attempt, the Valhalla (also the model name of the best Nordost interconnects and speaker cables, and expensive enough to pay for a "pre-owned" Mercedes). I didn't find the Shiva much out of the ordinary, and the Vishnu (what's with the Indian names here?) on a happy par with the outstanding Kimber Palladia. It's the Valhalla that has the magic (hope you don't need too many of these) in reducing AC line garbage almost to the level achieved by battery-operated electronics, but without dynamic compression or frequencylimiting side effects.

It undeniably tracks the sound of the absolute, a feat that puts it in a class by itself. And the price is supremely right (well, it was, before it just went up \$700), although the demand is such that you may have to wait in line at your dealer's door for the next batch to come through the importer's good offices. And just wait till you read the results, next time around, of our A/B comparison against the \$60,000+ Burmester player.
